On the BBC's Andrew Marr Show, Sir Christopher, when asked about a possible ban on MPs' second jobs, said it was important that experience was not lost to the Commons. But he acknowledged that voters wanted MPs to work full-time on their behalf, and insisted he would not pre-empt his committee's conclusions on the issue.

Sir Christopher on Sunday appeared to suggest he would not recommend a ban on outside work for MPs, saying it would risk losing "quite a lot of experience and diversity" from the Commons.
