MP's Additional Cost Allowances (ACA's)

My apologies for submitting this past the allowed date.

I have read many of the submissions posted on the website.

It is improper of MP's to take advantage of the ACA's to obtain the maximum allowance and to use this to purchase a property with untaxed funds for mortgage interest for a mortgage in excess of £300,000.00. And then to take the capital gain for themselves after at least paying 18% capital gain, if they had not further 'flipped' their designated home!

No one in the public service such as myself as a Doctor or my daughter, who is a trainee surgeon in the RAMC, when required to work away from home when training can obtain such financial advantages and support. My daughter will have her rent paid for basic accommodation if she has to work where there is no 'mess'. She has to pay for her food and travel back to her 'home'. All this is paid for if you are an MP and more such as improving your 'second' home thus increasing its worth.
